Call for applications for the YOUNG MARSILIUS FELLOWSHIPS for interdisciplinary research and science communication; motto of the year: "Friend & Foe"

Duration: 1 October 2021 to 30 September 2022; Application deadline: 31 July 2021

To Whom It May Concern,

The *Marsilius Kolleg* of Heidelberg University invites you to apply for a *Young Marsilius Fellowship for Interdisciplinary Research and Science Communication*. These fellowships offer excellent postdoctoral researchers from Heidelberg University and the surrounding extra-university research institutions an opportunity to actively participate in, and contribute to, the Marsilius Kolleg. As a Young Marsilius Fellow, you will have the opportunity to engage in an intensive exchange with other postdoctoral researchers and to participate in an interdisciplinary project to be developed together in collaboration. In addition, Young Marsilius Fellows take part in joint events with experts from the field of science communication. They receive a budget of €5,000 to be used freely for their own research and for academic training (subject to the applicable usage policy).

All postdoctoral researchers at Heidelberg University and surrounding institutions (see the list of addressees) whose doctorate was awarded no more than 3 years before 1 October 2021 (the start of the fellowship) are eligible to apply. In certain well-justified cases, exceptions to this requirement can be made, e.g. in the case of doctoral students who are well advanced and have a clear postdoctoral perspective at Heidelberg research institutions. (Junior) group leaders, junior professors or advanced *habilitands*, on the other hand, do not belong to the target group of the fellowship. Applicants should have sufficient knowledge of German and English to be able to

actively participate in the discussions. Contributions can be presented either in German or English.

The 'motto of the year' for the Young Marsilius Fellows 2021-22 is "Friend & Foe." This serves as a starting point for applications and as a leitmotif for a joint project, which will culminate in a final symposium. Here the Marsilius Kolleg is consciously adopting the guiding motif of the 17th issue of the research journal "Ruperto Carola". The current issue illustrates the broad and diverse applicability of this topic:

We would like to encourage all interested postdoctoral researchers to apply for a Young Marsilius Fellowship. If you are considering applying, we recommend that you first seek advice from the Managing Director of the Marsilius Kolleg, Tobias Just. Explanations of the selection procedure and conditions for application can be found on the following pages of this letter.

The deadline **for applications is 31 July 2021**. This deadline is not an absolute cut-off, but we cannot guarantee that all applications received after this date will be considered.

Selection Procedure and Criteria

Young Marsilius Fellows are selected by the Marsilius Kolleg on the basis of a recommendation by a multidisciplinary selection committee, which also includes an external member from the field of science communication. Selection criteria are:

- academic excellence demonstrated by the applicant's dissertation, publications, prizes and other awards
- willingness and ability to engage in interdisciplinary dialogue
- openness to participating in activities concerning science communication
- the quality of a letter in which, with reference to the motto of the year "Friend & Foe," the candidates explain their motivation to participate in the interdisciplinary discourse of the Marsilius Kolleg and in a reciprocal exchange between academia and society

Format and Design

The programme is designed to take into account the many requirements of the postdoctoral phase of an academic career. This means in particular that the time commitment of the Fellowship is limited, focused and flexible. The annual programme of the Young Marsilius Fellows consists of:

- a half-day kick-off and planning session
- a two-day retreat outside Heidelberg
- at least two full days of joint workshops
- one half-day workshop with each of the two visiting professors for science communication
- a full-day closing symposium

The dates of the workshops, the retreat and the final symposium are set by the Marsilius Kolleg in consultation with all Young Marsilius Fellows. The Fellows decide jointly on the content of the programme, the joint project and the final symposium. The Marsilius Kolleg is available for advice and support.

Expectations

As far as possible, Fellows are expected take part in all events of their Young Marsilius cohort. In addition, each Fellow should make at least one substantive contribution, such as a presentation, during the course of their year at the Marsilius Kolleg.

Use of the Young Marsilius Fellowships funds

The Marsilius-Kolleg provides all Young Marsilius Fellows with a budget of €5,000 each to cover expenses for their own research and academic training. The funds are administered by the Marsilius Kolleg. The current usage policies of the Excellence Strategy apply.
