Veranstaltung im Rahmen der **MARSILIUS-STUDIEN**

In a collaboration with the University of Warsaw, the Marsilius Seminar will focus on differences and similarities between Poland and Germany with respect to economic, psychological and digitization-related challenges of ageing societies. While both countries have similar demographic structures, the economies as well as the historical and institutional contexts differ significantly. Therefore, comparing both countries promises to be fruitful in respect to strategies of societal adaptation to demographic challenges. The seminar aims to address major challenges of ageing societies predominantly from three disciplinary perspectives: First, a macro- and microeconomic perspective, addressing issues such as financial resources, pension systems and health care cost management for aging well and also focusing on behavioral factors that affect how those challenges are handled. Second, psychology addresses behavioral and cognitive-emotional aspects related to getting older. Third, informatics and IT focuses in the context of aging on how smart assistive systems can support the aging process.
